Dr. Amy Oden is Professor of History of Christianity at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. She has also served on the faculties of Saint Paul School of Theology in Kansas City and Oklahoma City University. She earned her Ph.D. in religious stud-

ies from Southern Methodist University, writing her dissertation on Augustine.

Amy shares that teaching is her vocation, and she looks forward to every day with students. For the last 25 years, she has taught theology and history, and pursued scholarship in service of the church. Most of her work has been an effort to make ancient voices, especially women's, accessible to current audiences. Her most recent scholarship has focused on the radical practice of hospitality in early Christianity and its challenge for communities today.

Dr. Oden has published an anthology of women's primary source writings in the history of Christian thought (In Her Words) and was a primary sources editor for the study series Christian Believer: Historic Teachings of the Church.

Born and raised on the prairies of Oklahoma, she currently lives in Riverdale Park, MD with her husband, who is a United Methodist pastor.
